Old Testament

Zephaniah 1:7-16

A Be silent before the Lord God! Truthfully what can we even say? Anything we say before the Lord should begin, "O Lord, my God, I am deeply sorry for my sins and actions, please forgive me." Here, the prophet Zephaniah declares that those who think highly of themselves, believe they are too important, or think they deserve more than what they do, will face the wrath and punishment of God. No matter how great we think of ourselves or our possessions they are nothing before the Lord. Do not focus on how great you are or how great your things, instead think upon the greatness of God! Think upon His grace and mercy, because in the end, on the day of judgment, we will truly need God's grace and mercy through Christ. The Old Testament reading is from Zephaniah chapter 1:

⁷Be silent before the Lord GOD!

For the day of the LORD is near;
the LORD has prepared a sacrifice
and consecrated his guests.

⁸And on the day of the LORD's sacrifice—
"I will punish the officials and the king's sons
and all who array themselves in foreign attire.

⁹On that day I will punish
everyone who leaps over the threshold,
and those who fill their master's house

with violence and fraud.
¹⁰“On that day,” declares the LORD,
“a cry will be heard from the Fish Gate,
a wail from the Second Quarter,
a loud crash from the hills.
¹¹Wail, O inhabitants of the Mortar!
For all the traders are no more;
all who weigh out silver are cut off.
¹²At that time I will search Jerusalem with lamps,
and I will punish the men
who are complacent,
those who say in their hearts,
‘The LORD will not do good,
nor will he do ill.’
¹³Their goods shall be plundered,

Epistle

1 Thessalonians 5:1-11

A Night can be frightening. In fact, there are people that cannot even fall asleep unless they have a light or night light in their rooms because of the anxiety that darkness or night causes. Our Epistle today reminds us that we do not have to fear the darkness or night, because we are children of light or children of the day. As we put on the breastplate of faith and love and the helmet of salvation, we take comfort in knowing that God's love overcomes the darkness. Therefore, celebrate child of light. Our Epistle is from 1 Thessalonians chapter 5:

¹Now concerning the times and the seasons, brothers, you have no need to have anything written to you. ²For you yourselves are fully aware that the day of the Lord will come like a thief in the night. ³While people are saying, “There is peace and security,” then sudden destruction will come upon them as labor pains come upon a pregnant woman, and they will not escape. ⁴But you are not in darkness, brothers, for that day to surprise you like a thief. ⁵For you are all children of light, children of the day. We are not of the night or of the darkness. ⁶So then let us not sleep, as others do, but let us keep awake and be sober. ⁷For those who sleep, sleep at night, and those who get drunk, are drunk at night. ⁸But since we belong to the day, let us be sober, having put on the breastplate of faith and love, and for a helmet the hope of salvation. ⁹For God has not destined us for wrath, but to obtain salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ, ¹⁰who died for us so that whether we are awake or asleep we might live with him. ¹¹Therefore encourage one another and build one another up, just as you are doing.

Holy Gospel

Matthew 25:14-30

P Ask yourself, which servant are you? The pride or hopefulness in us might lead us to believe that we are one of the first two. That we are using our Master's gifts for good, and especially putting them to work. After all no one wants to be known as a slothful or lazy servant. Still at times we fall prey to that laziness. Therefore, listen to our Gospel this morning, and hear how God desires us to work. The Gospel is from Matthew chapter 25:

¹⁴[Jesus said:] “For it will be like a man going on a journey, who called his servants and entrusted to them his property. ¹⁵To one he gave five talents, to another two, to another one, to each according to his ability. Then he went away. ¹⁶He who had received the five talents went at once and traded with them, and he made five talents more. ¹⁷So also he who had the two talents

made two talents more. ¹⁸But he who had received the one talent went and dug in the ground and hid his master's money. ¹⁹Now after a long time the master of those servants came and settled accounts with them. ²⁰And he who had received the five talents came forward, bringing five talents more, saying, 'Master, you delivered to me five talents; here I have made five talents more.'²¹His master said to him, 'Well done, good and faithful servant. You have been faithful over a little; I will set you over much. Enter into the joy of your master.'²²And he also who had the two talents came forward, saying, 'Master, you delivered to me two talents; here I have made two talents more.'²³His master said to him, 'Well done, good and faithful servant. You have been faithful over a little; I will set you over much. Enter into the joy of your master.'²⁴He also who had received the one talent came forward, saying, 'Master, I knew you to be a hard man, reaping where you did not sow, and gathering where you scattered no seed, ²⁵so I was afraid, and I went and hid your talent in the ground. Here you have what is yours.'²⁶But his master answered him, 'You wicked and slothful servant! You knew that I reap where I have not sowed and gather where I scattered no seed?' ²⁷Then you ought to have invested my money with the bankers, and at my coming I should have received what was my own with interest. ²⁸So take the talent from him and give it to him who has the ten talents. ²⁹For to everyone who has will more be given, and he will have an abundance. But from the one who has not, even what he has will be taken away. ³⁰And cast the worthless servant into the outer darkness. In that place there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.'"




